When required, we will develop additional biodiversity conservation policies. When calculating our annual budget, we will carefully consider the financial implications of our biodiversity strategies.

Local Planning and Development:

We will participate in local planning and development proposals, ensuring that biodiversity conservation is a key consideration. Advocating for green infrastructure and nature-based solutions in development projects will be a priority.

Corporate Trustee of the Barton Bendish Poor's Charity Commitment:

In our capacity as the corporate Trustee of the Barton Bendish Poor's Charity, we will maintain a close partnership with Norfolk Wildlife Trust and proactively follow any recommendations provided by their surveyors.

Networking and Collaboration:

When appropriate, we will network with other councils and local environmental organisations to share best practices and collaborate on biodiversity conservation projects.

Barton Bendish Parish Council, despite limitations compared to councils with larger land management responsibilities, remains committed to playing a significant role in promoting biodiversity conservation, raising awareness, and advocating for policy changes within our local community and the broader region.
